A MESSAGE FROM THE EV CHAIR

How fantastic is it to be back....

Our horses might have been a bit fresh for the first few outings, we might have felt a bit rusty, and for some events, the weather has been less than kind, but it has been so good to have our equestrian community together again. Over the past month or so as COVID restrictions have finally eased, there has been a plethora of events across the state, including the Spring Horse Trials at Werribee, the Show Horse December Show, the Dressage Festival and Lakes and Craters Horse Trials. A huge thanks to all the clubs and organising committees that have worked so hard to put these and other events on, and a special thank you to everyone who has been so cooperative in navigating COVID protocols.

On a personal note, I have been lucky enough to have been out and about at the Elms Classic with the Sale SJ Club, Cora Lynn SJ Club as well as the MSJC event held on the magnificent new Martin Collins waxed surface at Werribee Park. The Martin Collins waxed surface is wonderful in terms of producing top quality competition, but also in making our sport safe and looking after the welfare of our horses. With this in mind, our submission to the State Government for funding for Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre prioritises redoing all the surfaces at Werribee to the same amazing standard.

As a Board, we unanimously support this upgrade submission and know that the benefit of upgrading the surfaces will be almost immediate, allowing opportunities for more riders to use Werribee Park for both competitions and training. The surface upgrade will also extend the season particularly once the main indoor is resurfaced. Other priorities, if we are successful in gaining funding, are covering the stables and improving the general amenities. Longer term there is a vision for upgrading the indoor and completing other 'big ticket' items on the Masterplan. If we can achieve delivery of the whole Masterplan, WPNEC will be a truly premier venue to help cater for the growth in equestrian sport. Also held recently, was the joint Equestrian Victoria and Racing Victoria OTT 2021 awards luncheon to celebrate the achievements of the many thoroughbred horses in our sport, paying a special mention to their owners, riders and trainers. The partnership between EV and RV is a highly valued one with the OTT program providing structure around the retraining and rehoming of the incredible thoroughbred horses post racing. EV is very proud to be associated with the OTT program's success.

You don't have to look far to see how versatile thoroughbreds are from pony club, adult riding club, polo, RDA and world class international competition - particularly eventing. Thoroughbreds are truly remarkable athletes.

On a national level, Equestrian Australia has its Annual General Meeting scheduled for Monday 17th January 2022. This will be the first time participating members will have the opportunity to vote for their elected board. Please look out for the agenda for the selection of candidates and vote as it is a significant change for members to have the opportunity to choose Board Directors. The AGM will be held online, (it's easy to register and vote) and we encourage all eligible members to participate.

At the end of a huge and somewhat challenging year, I'd like to extend my thanks to our Board and EV team for their dedicated service and commitment during 2021. Every contribution makes a difference and helps improve our enjoyment of our sport.

Finally, heading into summer, I hope you are all able to enjoy time with your friends and family. Have a wonderful Christmas and New Year break and I will look forward to seeing you in 2022!

RACING VICTORIA'S OFF THE TRACK AWARDS

Racing Victoria (RV) has announced the winner of the 2021 Acknowledged Retrainer of the Year Award, which recognises the achievements of equine experts preparing retired racehorses for secondary careers.

For the second year running, Fiona McIntyre has taken out the coveted RV Acknowledged Retrainer of the Year Award for her tireless work in promoting Off The Track thoroughbreds, helping to create as many pathways and opportunities as possible for ex-racehorses.

In the past 12 months, Fiona has achieved outstanding results with off-the-track horses on both a competitive and non-competitive front, including finding a suitable home for Torreggiante, affectionately known as Torre, through RV's RESET Program, helping him to enjoy a happy and healthy second career.

Fiona's dedication and talent for transitioning racehorses to make the most of their life after racing was also highlighted in 2021 with the transformation of the Chris Waller-trained Able Fun to a competing show horse, who has already picked up a few ribbons since the resumption of competitions in Victoria this year.

A Retrainer Capacity Grant recipient, Fiona has also been busy expanding her property to increase the number of horses she can take on and retrain for second careers after racing.

In an extremely competitive field, Jade Wills, owner and director of JW Equestrian, was awarded Acknowledged Retrainer of the Year Runner Up for her unwavering commitment to finding alternative, useful and loving homes for retired racehorses, resulting in over 130 off-thetrack thoroughbreds rehomed this year alone.

A 2021 Godolphin Stud and Stable award winner for thoroughbred care and welfare, Jade has recently expanded her operations to incorporate a riding school, providing increased opportunities to educate the equine community on the benefits of off-the-track thoroughbreds, as well as expanding the possibilities for retired racehorses to enjoy secondary careers in various disciplines including polo ponies, eventers, show jumpers and trail riders.

A panel of five esteemed judges, including Dr Andrew McLean, CEO of Equitation Science International; Catherine Murphy, sports journalist and presenter at the ABC; Fiona Selby, Director, Boneo Park; Carly Dixon, RV Executive General Manager of Corporate Affairs and Robbie Griffiths, President of the Australian Trainers Association, selected the final winners which were presented today (7 December 2021) at an intimate event co-hosted by Equestrian Victoria.

The RV Retrainer of the Year received a cheque for \$5,000 to assist with the continuing development of their retraining and rehoming work, and the runner-up received \$1,000 to go towards their work with off-the-track horses.

The Off The Track horse of the Year was also presented across four different categories:

- Off The Track Horse of the Year Show Horse, joint winners – JD Kiamichi (Racing name: Tarantino) and Stage Presence (Racing name: Persistency)
- Off The Track Horse of the Year Dressage Coromandel Bay (Racing name: Ha Kul)
- Off The Track Horse of the Year Eventing Mr Pig
 (Racing Name: Winnie's Horse)
- Off The Track Horse of the Year Jumping Secret Mojo (Racing Name: Secret Mojo)

Introduced in 2020, Racing Victoria's 'RESET (Racehorse, Evaluation, Support, Education and Transition) Program' provides direct support for horses that are sound and have good prospects but have not been successful in transitioning to a second career outside racing.

In recognition of the great work by many RV Acknowledged Retrainers to retrain and rehome a RESET horse within the past 12 months, a RESET Achievement Award was introduced.

The winner of the 2021 RESET Achievement Award is Louise Abey, who was recognised for her exceptional efforts retraining Retro Lass, Mareeza Brown and Soomayya, who she trained with calm and effective retraining methods to transform them into well-rounded performance horses.

Lou's willingness to go over and above the RESET program requirements by providing her horses with multiple outings and exposing them to a range of different scenarios is outstanding and has set a bench mark for the program. Lou was also recognised for her commitment to promoting Off The Track and the RESET Program.

FIONA MCINTYRE - ACKNOWLEDGED RETRAINER OF THE YEAR FOR THE SECOND YEAR IN A ROW

"We are thrilled to see Fiona once again awarded the Retrainer of the Year.

"For many years Fiona has worked tirelessly in promoting Off The Track and retired racehorses at every chance she gets, and she doesn't seem to be showing any signs of slowing down now!

"Fiona has a genuine love and passion for thoroughbreds and is a great advocate for the breed and the various Off The Track programs in everything she does, as well as continuing to educate trainers, owners, the equestrian community and the general public about life after racing opportunities for racehorses.





VICSPORT SUPPORT FOR INTERSCHOOL

Equestrian Victoria has received a grant from the Vicsport Guiding Sport project, to review and update standards at Interschool and Junior events. Tim Calkin - EA Coach of the Month. Story & Photos courtesy of Equestrian Australia

COACH OF THE MONTH is a regular Education series on the EA website. It is a way of highlighting the EA coaches and educators who work with dedication and passion all over Australia.

Tim Calkin is an EA Level Two General Coach and Coach Educator, based in Badger Creek, VIC.

"My family emigrated to Australia from the UK in 1960 when I was 5 years old. When I was 14, my Aunt saw how desperate I was to learn to ride and gave me a few lessons for my birthday.

My first instructor was Eric Blinden, who was based in Croydon in Victoria; old-school, but a great start. A little bay gelding, called Jimmy, was my first pony and together we attended the Mountain District Pony Club. In those days we used to hack 10km to rallies, ride all day and ride home again. The horses were certainly fit!

In 1970, my family decided to return to the UK and, after a year at high school, I started as a working pupil at Heather Hall Riding School, in Leicestershire. I achieved my BHSAI in 1971.

The next three years were spent in Manchester at the Lodge Riding School; probably the funniest, craziest place I've ever worked. Thanks to Facebook, I'm back in touch with some of those friends after 40 years.

I then worked for show jumpers Mannie Beavan and, Olympian, Tim Grubb. What an experience that was! Although no matter how hard they tried, my show jumping never really improved. With their support, I sat and passed my BHSII in 1979.

COACHING MATTERS

I took a job at Wellow Park Stables, in Nottinghamshire, as Chief Instructor in 1980. Riding clients' horses, I was lucky to have the opportunity to event to 3*. In 1985 I passed my BHSI.

They were good days, as we did hunter hire and got our event horses going by hunting with the Grove and Rufford and Belvoir Hunts. The scariest thing I ever did was team chasing and a couple of Point to Points. They always started and finished in the beer tent, funny that...

After turning freelance and spending some time teaching in the United Arab Emirates, I started travelling to Australia for six months of each year. I established myself teaching at Pony Clubs and clinics around the Yarra Valley and Gippsland, where I still coach regularly.

In 1988, I emigrated permanently to Australia. I married Rachael in 1994 and, thanks to Stephen Coffey, we managed and eventually bought Braidwood Equestrian Centre, near Healesville in Victoria.

From Braidwood, we ran clinics for riders on our school horses and on their own horses. We also stood thoroughbred stallion, Balmoral Kinsman, at stud. He was by the well-known stallion Balmoral Boy. At that time, I competed Balmoral Kinsman (Tosh) to Medium and started having lessons with Miguel Tavora. Over more than 20 years, Miguel became my friend and mentor until his death in 2017.



Things changed drastically in 2009 when Braidwood was hit by the Black Saturday bushfires. In the space of a couple of hours, we lost our best school horse, Zebedee, along with four cows and a calf. We also lost 80% of our fences, along with sheds, hay and most of the pasture and surrounding bush. Luckily, thanks to a good fire plan, we saved the house, indoor arena and 17 horses.

After the trauma of the fire, Braidwood was never quite the same and so, in 2013, we purchased a much smaller property on the other side of Healesville and downsized the business to one school horse with more emphasis on private lessons and clinics.

Up until International travel stopped in 2020, I was returning to Europe more regularly, combining visiting family and friends with clinics in the UK and the Netherlands.

In 2001, I crossed over into the then NCAS system, becoming a Level 2 General Coach. This introduced me to the new path of Coach Education. This is a subject I'm passionate about because, without new and younger coaches coming into the system, equestrian sports can't evolve and improve.

I'm very lucky to have trained under the British Horse Society system which is based on riding schools. This differs from the Australian system, which is more competitionbased. Both systems have their advantages and disadvantages.

Since becoming a Coach Educator, I've been lucky enough to sit on the Victorian Coaching Committee and the Equestrian Australia Coaching Committee. In 2019, I was one of Australia's delegates for the International Group for Equestrian Qualifications (IGEQ), travelling to Germany for the annual conference.

My reasons for becoming involved in these committees is simple;

the more we put into our system the better it gets, and ultimately, it's the horse that benefits.

My involvement has also led to some great friendships. As coaches, we work by ourselves for much of our working lives and being involved with the coaching committees I've met some very talented, experienced coaches from all over Australia and the world, who I now count as friends. I also administrate the Equestrian Victoria Coaching Facebook Page with over 600 followers. I try and share as much relevant content as I can, because I feel that helps to connect coaches, both in Australia and overseas.

Although my competition days are probably over, I am still riding and I'm lucky enough to own a lovely six-year-old Sandreo mare, who has made me re-evaluate and refine my training skills, especially in these long periods of lockdown.

I've come to realise how unique every horse and rider is, and while it's important to have a solid foundation, there is no one way to get the best out of both. That comes from experience, hard work and knowledge.

My skill set seems suited for working with young riders to develop their understanding for training often difficult horses and ponies. I believe this ability has come from training & watching coaches, from every horse I've ridden, trained and watched, from every competition I've entered and from every job I've had. In short, my ability as a coach is the sum total of all my life experiences to date, and I'm still learning.



My friends know I love new technology, but also renovating old stuff. It's the same with horses. I love working with young horses but there's nothing better than helping a damaged or difficult horse to work in a soft and relaxed way with a rider who understands what they are doing."

FEEDING TIPS TO SUPPORT GUT HEALTH

Horses have a specialised digestive system designed for the continuous ingestion of grass and other forage. When we mess with this system, such as limiting forage, we can very quickly cause gastrointestinal upsets that can have serious consequences. Problems are more often due to poor feeding management rather than the feed itself.

The following points are important in keeping a horse's digestive system functioning smoothly.



Horses must have adequate fibre intake throughout the day, which closely mimics the horse's evolutionary adaption to eating. Always offer at least 1% of body weight in forage (hay, chaff, pasture), ideally 1.5%. For example, a 500kg horse requires between 5-7.5kg forage (dry matter) per day. Look for low-sugar hays for over-weight horses, so that recommended daily intake can be achieved to maintain gut health.



Ensure forage is available 24/7. If pasture grazing is unavailable, then ad-lib hay must be provided. Hay nets or constant small hay meals ensure your horse never has an empty stomach. Slow-feeder hay nets are helpful for greedy or overweight horses.



More frequent and smaller meals greatly decrease feeding-related problems. Never offer more than 2.5kg of grain per meal. Divide grain into 2 of more feeds per day.

Within reason, regularity of feeding is crucial. Horses thrive on routine - upsetting the routine can cause stress, which can negatively affect gut function.

Offer hay or chaff before exercise so that the horse is not worked on an empty stomach. A small meal of high fibre feed/hay will provide a 'raft' within the stomach preventing acid splash during exercise and protect the sensitive gastric mucosa. Research has shown lucerne hay/chaff, has a buffering effect on the stomach and is a good choice to feed before exercise.



Eliminate the possibility of bad feed. Proper storage of feed is crucial to the prevention of mould, rancidity, and loss of feed quality.

Feed by weight, not volume. The bulk densities of feeds vary significantly, and feeding "by the scoop" is not appropriate.

Free choice access to clean water, except immediately after intense exercise, will keep the digestive system functioning.

Ensure regular checks by a veterinarian or qualified equine dentist to maintain functional dentition.



Routinely worm your horse, ideally after a regular faecal worm counts to ensure the correct anthelmintic is used.



Engage the help of a qualified equine nutritionist to design the best diet for your individual horse.
