SUMMER HAS BEEN BUSY AFTER WHAT SEEMS LIKE AN ETERNITY IN COVID LIMBO

ORGANISING COMMITTEES ACROSS THE
STATE HAVE BEEN WORKING AWAY IN THE
BACKGROUND, AND AS WE HAVE COME INTO THE

Most recently I attended the Australian Youth Dressage championships at Boneo Park. It was just lovely to see so many of our young riders, from Victoria as well as interstate, enjoying their horse sports and putting on such a professional display. The achievements of our young riders is all the more remarkable given the length of time spent in iso-training. A big thanks to Jan Smith and the organising committee for delivering such a great event, especially given that most of the hard yards were done over the Christmas New Year period when most of us were enjoying some down time. We all know how hard it is to organise these big events in normal times. The complexity of adding in Covid safe measures and the uncertainty this brings makes organisation so challenging at the moment, and the event you ran is a credit to you and all who were involved.

Next we hand over to the show horse committee who are flat out getting ready for both Barastoc and a jumbo double-up Nationals. The logistical challenges of fitting two years into one has not made life easy, but again I know there is a massive effort going on behind the scenes to make it all work. I'm very grateful to you all, and hope everyone will take the opportunity to thank the organisers for the hard work in putting on events for us to enjoy.

On that note, I'd also mention the support we get from the Victorian state government to host events of national significance such as this. It is gratefully appreciated.

Another highlight of the summer, though nonhorse related, has been watching Ash Barty crystallising into a fully blown Australian legend. There are so many adjectives that come to mind to describe Ash Barty - humble, gracious, tenacious, determined, human, polite, are just some. I just love what she represents in how she plays her sport. Her attitude that "its just a game of tennis" belies her absolute professionalism. She manages to keep her incredible success in perspective, and always has a seemingly endless supply of calm and balance. Mistakes are put in the past and she focuses on the next point. She is a fantastic role model for all athletes, and I'd like to be able to have half of her composure, grace under pressure and ability to focus.

The other topic that I know has caused some concern has been the EA AGM and election of directors. I wrote before Christmas that I was looking forward to being able to elect members to the EA Board for the first time in history, and I am disappointed that we were not given that opportunity. The rationale that the EA Board could not go outside the determination of the nominations committee it set up may have been strictly legal, but with good faith I believe that they may have been able to come to an alternative that would have allowed a member vote. It is disappointing that this was not the outcome, and I hope that in future the EA Board will engage with us. (both as state branches and as individual members) to bring about a better outcome.

The next important step is the Strategic and Structural review of EA, and we as a Board will continue to engage with EA, the other states and the discipline chairs, to advocate for improving our sporting landscape for the benefit of all members. We have a great sport, with lots of unmet demand, so we must make the most of this opportunity to get it right for the next generation. Who knows, the Ash Barty of equestrian is out there somewhere.

RUNNING EVENTS DURING COVID TIMES

RUNNING EQUESTRIAN EVENTS ARE NEVER AN EASY TASK AND SO MANY PEOPLE NEED TO COME TOGETHER TO MAKE IT HAPPEN. BUT WHAT DOES RUNNING AN EVENT DURING A TIME WHEN WE ARE ALL TOLD TO 'STAY APART' LOOK LIKE?

We spoke to Georgie Stayches from Fetching Events, who has been guiding us through the myriad of COVIDSafe Settings about her experience as a volunteer at the recent. Northern Park Lakes & Craters International Horse Trials.

One of the first events to return after lockdown in 2020, the Horse Trials once again led the way in planning and delivering a COVIDSafe event for competitors, volunteers and family and friends in 2021.

Supported by the local council with a COVIDSafe kit full of masks, gloves, signage, sanitizer and disinfectant, the event put their best foot forward in creating a safe and welcoming environment for their competitors.

While COVID settings were new to us all last year, this year they were the normal and this was reflected in the co-operation of all competitors, food stall and trade stands to comply with the current settings.

The power of good communication, warm welcomes and plenty of kindness shone through and while we haven't returned to 2019, the next normal has brought with it some positive (not COVID!) outcomes. A few examples of how early and strong communication from the organising team, eased any concerns or hesitancy in complying with COVID settings are:

Strong pre event communication resulted in competitors arriving with their phones in hand, ready to scan in at the front gate

Everyone eagerly showed the COVID Check In Marshall their phone once checked in for proof of

checking in

Having the required COVID Check In Marshall on the front gate, also resulted in an unofficial welcoming party which people found really friendly and welcoming. This additional touch point created a foundation for new conversations and the role doubled as registration assistance, with the Check In Marshall guiding competitors to their allocated sites and yards.

Visible cleaning, plenty of COVIDSafe signage and regular walks of the venue to check hand sanitiser and wipe down of surfaces, was a clear signal that the organising team cared about their competitors and were focused on creating a safe venue for them. This in turn encouraged compliance across the venue with a general adherence to physical distancing and mask wearing (where required). Anecdotal evidence demonstrated that competitors were grateful for the COVIDSafe planning and regularly thanked the COVIDSafe staff for all their work.

Change is always difficult but with the right communication and the organising committee setting the tone, COVIDSafe events can be delivered in the friendliest and most welcoming of environments, resulting in strong cooperation and compliance from competitors, volunteers, officials, vendors and spectators.

EQUESTRIAN VICTORIA PRESENTED THE STOTTS HILL FRANKSTON STH 2022 AUSTRALIAN YOUTH DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS ON 13 - 16 JANUARY AT BONEO PARK EQUESTRIAN CENTRE.

Attracting record entries, the event was held at Boneo Park 13-16 January and walked a fine line dealing with all that Covid threw at both the event and the community. The Organising Committee for the event consisted of Bianca Veneziano, Kate Dertell, Donna Desmet, Aengus Wright, Jan Smith and with support from Lauren and Gus Braniff. International scoring company Black Horse One was well received for its coverage and versatility and judges came from around Australia with four FEI judges, including Tokyo Olympics Ground Jury member Susie Hoevenaars.

This is traditionally a show that values its sponsors and for 2022 we had a wonderful line up including the naming rights sponsor Stotts Hill Frankston Sth, a land development project due for release this Autumn and launched at this event by

the Pask Group. As an Australian Championships we were also very fortunate to receive support from the Victorian Government and the Significant Sporting Events Program.

The Championships, which rotate between the eastern states with Victoria running the event every three years, has as its motto "Young Riders, the future of our Sport" and it really does live up to this providing competition from the grass roots entry level to the highest level, the Grand Prix. A range of FEI classes are run, catering for riders from twelve years of age to twenty five and they were very well supported with the U25 Grand Prix classes attracting a record field for Australia of eight riders at close of entries.

There is no denying that Covid did affect the event with both young

riders and their parents having to pull out due to illness and isolating but the most important aspect is that, with careful planning and monitoring we were able to run. It was tense leading up to the event but all involved tried very hard to minimise the effects.

A slightly toned down series of educational opportunities and workshops were held with the undoubted highlight having famous AFL footballer Travis Cloke address the riders on the importance of sport to their lives before the presentations on the Friday of the event.




BARASTOC HORSE OF THE YEAR

IT'S GIRL POWER TO THE FORE AT THIS YEAR'S P.S.I. DRESSAGE & JUMPING WITH THE STARS: GERMAN DRESSAGE RIDER CHARLOTT SCHÜRMANN AND SWEDISH JUMPING RIDER HELENA TORSTENSSON WILL BE SHARING THEIR EXPERTISE AND TRAINING WISDOM.

Charlott was preparing for her first visit to Australia in 2020 when the pandemic and international border closures put a stop to any travel plans. Since then, the professional rider has been busy campaigning her team of talented young dressage horses, among them Hof Kasselmann's elegant chestnut gelding Absinth, on whom she placed fourth at the 2021 Nürnberger Burg-Pokal Final. Charlott is a regular and former winner at this event, having qualified no less than five (!) horses for Germany's most prestigious dressage prize for 7-9 year-old horses. Her fine riding style was honoured with the event's equitation prize and is also the reason why Hof Kasselmann and PSI often entrust her with the training of some of their stable stars.

Sweden is on top of the showjumping world after the Swedish riders took Team Gold in Tokyo last year. So it comes as no surprise that a Swedish rider's name was put forward by none other than Paul Schockemöhle, legendary competitor, trainer, breeder and one half of P.S.I. Performance Sales International. Helena Torstensson first started working for Schockemöhle in Germany 16 years ago. In 2012 she became the Head of Operations at Schockemöhle's Swedish breeding site, PS Flyinge and Partners, where she was responsible for the young stallions' training, development and preparation as well as the popular Flyinge Open Sales Auctions. For the past ten years she has been dividing

her time between

Germany and Sweden and has also been credited with really putting the Schockemöhle brand and stallions on the map in her home country.

An accomplished and active competitor herself, Helena has competed up to 3* level. During her time in Germany, she has been in the saddle of gun jumping stallions Quintender, Last Man's Hope, Centadel or Balou de Rouet, but has also ridden current dressage superstar Total Hope, when he was standing at stud in Sweden.

Helena also loves to teach and is especially looking forward to the masterclass. She counts Peter Eriksson, Kyra Kyrklund, Heinrich-Wilhelm 'Kaiser' Johannsmann and Franke Sloothaak among her own trainers, the latter a well-loved guest judge at DJWTS 2006! This will be Helena's first trip to Australia, but she's eager to see the local young horse competition and breeding scene, "At the top jumping level we only see the end of it, but it all has a beginning — it starts with the foal. The success for everyone in the sport and in the breeding goes really hand in hand."

Both guest stars will show their skills in the saddle when they judge the dressage and jumping young horse champions of each age group and also present the popular masterclasses, which are finally back for this year's DJWTS.

CHANGES TO EA DRESSAGE TESTS

2022 EA DRESSAGE RULE BOOK UPDATE

Amendments to the EA Dressage Rules which support the change to the marking of technical faults in EA tests, as approved by the EA Board as of 1 January 2022, have now been updated in the 2022 EA Dressage Rule Book.

Updated versions of the Rule Book can be located on the <u>Dressage Rules and Test Page of the EA Website</u>.

Amendments to the EA Dressage Rules (25/01/2022) which support the change to the marking of technical faults in EA tests as approved by the EA Board as of 1 January 2022 can be found HERE

CHANGE TO EA DRESSAGE TESTS

Following on from the 2022 change in the calculation of Penalties on FEI Dressage score sheets, including FEI Young Horse (Art 430-6.2), the Equestrian Australia Dressage Committee (EADC) is adopting the change for all EA level test sheets.

"Penalties" are now "Technical Faults' and changed to an 0.5% non-cumulative deduction (previously 2

penalty points). Implementation is from 1/1/2022.

The EADC believe this is much fairer for a mistake that does not impact on the actual judging of performance.

Revised test sheets showing the change are now available on the <u>EA website</u>.

Update 12.01.22:

ALLOCATION OF PENALTIES IN DRESSAGE TESTS - CLARIFICATION

In response to a number of queries regarding the allocation of penalties in Dressage tests, the following dot points outline the process:

Errors of course are to be deducted from the final score as per current practice

- · The final mark is calculated as a percentage
- 0.5% to be deducted from the overall percentage for any other penalties/technical errors

This will take place immediately, and the rules will be updated accordingly as from 1 July 2022

NEW JUMPING RULES effective I January 2022

The updated 2022 National Jumping Rules effective 1 January 2022 have been published on the EA website and can be found on this link https://www.equestrian.org.au/Jumping-rules

Some of the larger changes are

- · Updates to scoring under Table A events
- Helmet Tagging
- · Updates to Dress, Protective Headgear and Salute
- Updates to rules for Futurity horses for calendar year
 2022 (due to Covid restrictions)

These updates also now include the FEI updates following their General Assembly and publication of the updated FEI Rules.

UPDATE TO JJD SCORING SYSTEM - NOTE FOR CLUBS USING JJD SOFTWARE

As a result of the rule changes mentioned above it was discussed advising our clubs and secretaries who are using the JJD scoring system you may need to update your scoring system software. So it may be ideal to do this a few days out from the next event you are intending to use the software at.

OFFICIALS ACCREDITATION

To maintain EA Officials accreditation, EA Officials must submit accreditation forms every 3 years. The 3-year reaccreditation cycle is coming to an end in March 2022.

To maintain your EA Officials accreditation, you will have needed to make sure you have met the update requirements set out in the Sport Rules which will enable you to re-accredit for the next 3-year period 1/4/2022 - 31/3/25.

Within the first 2 weeks of February, you will receive an e-mail giving you all the necessary re-accreditation information and forms that you will need to submit by 31 March 2022 to stay listed as an EA Official.

BONEO PARK WELCOMES COMPETITORS FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY FOR THE AUSTRALIAN JUMPING CHAMPIONSHIPS

It has been a long wait, however, the Boneo Park Equestrian Centre will, once again, become the focus of Jumping in Australia when the venue hosts the 2021 Pryde's EasiFeed Australian Jumping Championships. While COVID-19 caused the cancellation of the 2020 Championships, this event is the delayed 2021 Championships and will run for 5 full days from Wednesday 2nd to Sunday 6th of February 2022.

Situated on the beautiful Mornington Peninsula, Boneo Park will host the very best horse and rider combinations from around the country in what will be a five-day Jumping extravaganza.

The 2021 Pryde's EasiFeed Australian Jumping Championships will be the third time in recent years that Boneo Park has hosted the Championships and with the 2022 Championships scheduled at the usual time of early November, this year will be a bonanza for Jumping fans.

- Australian Senior Champion sponsored by Pryde's EasiFeed.

An Off-The-Track Championship will also be claimed, sponsored by the Racing Victoria Off-The-Track Program - dedicated to the welfare of retired racing thoroughbreds.

The Senior Championship will bring together the best riders from across the country including Amber Fuller - the 2018 Australian Senior Champion, Billy Raymont who performed brilliantly for Australia at the 2018 World Equestrian Games and James Paterson-Robinson who represented Australia at the 2012 and 2016 Olympic Games. Competing alongside them will be three legends of the sport; Chris Chugg and Victorians, Russell Johnstone and Jamie Coman. Between them, in their stellar careers, they have represented Australia multiple times in international competitions, including Olympic Games, World



Spectators will not only have world class jumping to enjoy, but also an extensive trade village, merchandise sales and a range of refreshments - a day out at Boneo Park becomes an unforgettable experience.

The on-site restaurant 'Arilla' will be open for lunch and dinner throughout the Championships. 



Equestrian Australia is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children in Equestrian by providing a safe and inclusive environment and by ensuring that everyone involved in Equestrian is educated and informed of their responsibilities to protect and look after children. Child Safe Standards re mandated by the government and clubs and associations must be compliant as of 1 July.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

As part of the Child Safeguarding Policy engaged personnel in a paid or volunteer capacity in **any sports training or competitions, with participants 18 years and under, must have a current Working with Children Check** as specified by their relevant state or territory.

Judges and Officials fall into the volunteer category as they are only paid a per diem rate so there is no cost for the check.
